Matt's veterinary career commenced in a mixed dairy cattle practice on mid-north coast in 1995. He transitioned to aquatic animals from 2000 working for NSW Fisheries at Wollongbar Agriculture Institute.

Work spans many aquaculture species including variety of fish; prawns; and oysters all around Australia and beyond. From tank-based systems to earthen ponds and to sea cages - all systems.
